BOARD AND KEEL BOAT CAPTAINS

CHANGES TO THE FLEET MAY BE COMING COMMENTS BY BILL CARTER AND JACOB HUGHES

Michael, Chris, and Bill did a trial excursion with board boats over at Temple lake park, and we thought it would be good to share some impressions.

There is a section of shoreline in Temple Lake Park facing the open lake on a finger with 3 or 4 picnic tables, it is less popular with the swimmers but very good for launching small sailboats. In addition, someone had a jet ski there. The water is shallow out to quite some distance, which is convenient.

The wind was blowing from the north at about 12 knots, which is good wind speed for Lasers. The wind was enough to get the boats up on a plane (and splash some spray back into your face). Coming back in was a little challenging because our site was somewhat upwind. I have found that it is best to have a spare person onshore to help catch you and stabilize the boat when you come back in, so with two boats in action there should be at least 3 people for safety and comfort.

Sunday May 31st we had our first First Sail. This is a US Sailing program designed to get people involved in sailing at a reasonable cost. We had 2 couples participate and both couples are interested in joining the LBYC.

Finally, big news, we have an offer to buy the Capri. We also have an offer to trade the J24 for a J22. The plan is to use the funds from the Capri to purchase a second J22 so we can race them on Lake Belton and around the state. The J22 is much easier to handle and set up, which is better for our Club purposes. The board has approved this transaction, so members check your emails for voting. The sooner we get this done the quicker we can turn the fleet over.
